What keeps us up at night?

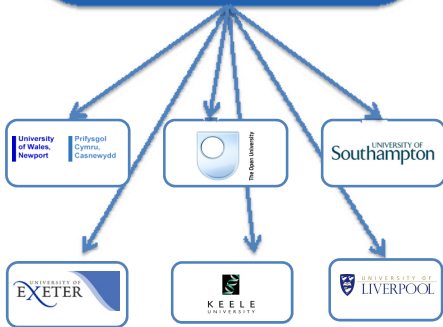
- Are OERs that focus on a current and developing topic like "climate change" more difficult to release?
